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BOG-35(2013)-11: Implementation of HAG Scale in NITs for faculty members.

MHRD vide Letter No.F.No.34-9/2012-TS-III, dt.22.03.2013 directed that in order to have uniformity and hassle free implementation of HAG Scale, the Ministry worked out guidelines and requested to all NITs to follow these guidelines while fixing the HAG scales to 20% Professors including the Directors on deputation or on any other engagement working elsewhere in the country and abroad. Guidelines for implement6atiion of HAG Scales for Professors in NITs was given in the Annexure.

The Board approved the proposal.

BOG-35(2013)-12: Policy on award on Designation on MACP to Officers.

As per the existing practice of the Institute, non-officer staff, on award of MACP are given both higher GP and higher designation in the cadre. However, for officers, the Board has not yet taken a de finite decision on the subject. Therefore Officers, on promotion under MACP, get the higher grade pay but confirm with their old designation. It is proposed to change the practice to come in line with that followed for Non-Officer staff, i.e. to award both higher GP/AGP and maintaining designation of the cadre on award of MACP.

BOG-35(2013)-14: Confirmation of New Faculty members.

260 faculty members have been recruited/promoted during the period from April, 2006 to November, 2011, out of which 49 faculty members have resigned, 118 faculty members have already been confirmed, and confirmation of 56 faculty members are due. Probation period of remaining 37 faculty members are yet to be completed.





The Board directed that the performance of the candidates should be reviewed by the Director within 31.7.2013 and with the approval of the Chairman, BOG, confirmation of the faculty members may be given. This need not be put up to the Board for approval again.

BOG-35(2013)-15: Proposal for Guest House Tariff Structure and Rules.

The Board vide resolution No BOG-30(2012)10: dt 29.06.2012, constituted a committee to examine the (existing regulations, tariff structure of comparable Institutes (IITs, NITs) and prescribe a management system for the Guest House. The draft report of the committee was put up in the 31st BOG meeting.

BOG-35(2013)-18: Personnel issues:

(1) E.O.L.:

Dr. Bidyut Kumar Patra [EC:1110983], joined this Institute service as an Asst. Professor in the Department of Computer Science & Engineering on 10.10.2011(AN). He has been offered fellowship for a period of 12 months i.e. [from 01.05.2013 to 30.04.2014] for conducting advance research in the field of data mining at VTT, Finland. Now, he has requested for permission to join the above assignment by 01.05.2013 on E.O.L. [without pay].

Dr. Patra's research experience in advance institute will be helpful in raising the academic standard of the department. There is no other way of acquiring such expertise and help.

His request for E.O.L. [without pay] w.e.f. 26.04.2013 to 04.05.2014 [including journey period] to join the above assignment is recommended.

The Board approved the proposal

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(2) Resignation:

Resignation from the Institute service tendered by Prof. G. R. Satapathy, Professor [BM] has been accepted w.e.f. 4th May, 2011(F.N.) vide BOG resolution No. BOG-33(2013) — 07(3) dt. 18.01.2013. While calculating terminal dues for final settlement, F & A Office has informed that Prof. Satapathy has drawn salary regularly up to 31st August, 2011 and the dues payable to him by the Institute is almost nil.

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In view of the above, Prof. Satpathy has been advised to refund immediately Rs. 3,64,983/-(Rupees Three Lakh Sixty four thousand Nine hundred Eighty Three) only towards excess salary drawn during the period from 4th May, 2011 to 31st August, 2011 vide letter No NITR/ES/2013/L/1920 dt. 13.03.2013.

The Board advised the administration that legal opinion may be sought from the Institute advocate and action may be taken for recovery of the excess payment made based on the legal opinion.

(3) Extension of contractual period of Prof. Swapan Kumar Karak, Asst. Professor, [MM].

Prof Karak was granted contractual appointment vide condition No.01 of the offer of appointment, for a period of 02 years i.e. up to June 30, 2013 or till he obtain his Ph. D. degree whichever is earlier. In case of failure, his appointment will be withdrawn and contract terminated. He has accepted the offer and joined this Institute service on 01.07.2011(FN).

However, he has submitted his Ph D thesis on 11th March, 2013. His thesis review report [both from India and Foreign] have already been received on 26th April, 2013. He is expecting to complete his Ph D. degree by the end of July, 2013.

Keeping the above progress in view, it is recommended to extend his contractual period up to 30th September, 2013.

Up gradation of Stenographers in Non-Secretariat Central Govt. Offices recommendation of 5th Central Pay Commission- reg. OM No. – 35034/4/97-Estt(D), dated 11th April, 2001 issued by DoPT, Gol (AnnexureA7) requires that all posts of Sr. Personal Assistant in non-Secretarial. Central Government offices should be re-designated as Private Secretary and posts of Sr. Private Secretary should be created in the pay scale of 7500-175-12000 (5th CPC) by up-grading the posts of Private Secretary (including the erstwhile posts of Sr. Personal Assistant). The OM also provides for upgrading of the existing incumbents of the posts of Private Secretary (including the erstwhile posts of Sr. Personal Assistant).

5th CPC pay scale of Sr. Personal Assistant was 1 6500-200-10500, revised to PB-2 with GP OF 1 4600 under 6th CPC. As such, the post is equivalent / analogous to the post of Sr. Secretary in the institute. Further, the post of Sr. Private Secretary is equivalent / analogous to the post of Secretary (Selection Grade – II) in PB-2 with GP of Rs.4800.

After rationalization of staff structure of the institute, stenographic assistance is being provided only to Director and Registrar. There were two posts in the pay scale of Rs 5000-150-8000/- (5th CPC) by designation of Secretary (Grade – II). These posts were granted the replacement pay scale of PB-2 with GP of Rs.4200 under 6th CPC revision w.e.f 01/01/2006 and subsequently re-designated as Secretary as per the new Staff Structure.

The administration has got a request to apply the provisions of DOPT OM of April, 2001 to cadre of Secretary of the Institute created as per directions of MHRD.

A letter was sent to MHRD vie No.NITR/RG/2013/L/608, dt.19.02.2013 for advice.

The Board was requested to consider if the designation and pay scale of incumbent Secretaries can be upgraded in line of the Govt, order of 2001.

The Board advised the administration to obtain the advice from MHRD.

1) Proposal for extension of Contractual Services of Senior Engineers.

The Board vide resolution No.BOG-26(2011)-14 dt.17.06.2011 had approved the extension of contract period of Prof. A. K. Panda, Visiting Professor (Civil), Prof. Y. K. Sahu, Visiting Professor (Electrical) and Prof. A. K. Sahoo, VP (CE) from 01.07.2011 up to 30.06.2013. Further the BOG vide resolution No. BOG-30(2012)-19: Dt.29.06.2012 approved the appointment of Mr. M.S.P. Rao from 10.07.2012 to 09.07.2013.

Now massive construction work is going on and more is expected to be taken up shortly. The service of Prof. A. K. Panda, Prof. Y. K. Sahu, Prof. A. K. sahoo and Mr. M.S. P. Rao are essential because we do not have any Senior Engineering positions. It is proposed to extend their tenure from 01.07.2013 to 30.06.2015. Prof. Y. K. Sahu, Prof. A. K. Panda and Prof. A. K. Sahoo and Mr Rao are presently getting Rs.40,000/- p.m. (consolidated). They may be given remuneration of Rs.50,000/- P.M. (consolidated) which will remain fixed for the next 2 years.

The Board approved the proposal for extension of the tenure of Prof. A. K. Panda, Prof. Y. K. Sahu, Prof. A. K. sahoo and Mr. M.S. P. Rao from 01.07.2013 to 30.06.2015 at a consolidated remuneration of Rs.50,000/-P.M., which will remain fixed for the next 2 years.

Subsequently, he was selected to join as an Associate Professor in IIT-Bhubaneswar. He requested to be relieved on lien. However, in view of his short period of service in the Institute, his request was not granted on the basis of Institute rules. Further, due to less than 20 years of total service (rendered in NITR + UCEB), he was also not eligible for taking Voluntary Retirement. Finally on his request, he was released on 14.07.2009 on Technical Resignation to enable him to join IIT-Bhubaneswar.

This Institute was prepared to transfer pension liabilities to IIT-Bhubaneswar u/r 26(2) of the CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972 to enable past service combination of Prof. Mohapatra. However, IIT-Bhubaneswar desired to treat his appointment in IIT-Bhubaneswar as permanent absorption and therefore, requested to pay the terminal benefits directly to Prof. Mahapatra u/r 37 & 37A of the aforesaid rules. The issue is still pending.

The matter was taken up with the MHRD vide this Institute's letter dated. 05 07:2012 while seeking certain clarifications on service – transfer of Prof. Mahapatra; especially in view of the applicability of Rule 26(2) or Rule 37 & 37(A) of the CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972. In respect to that, the MHRD (vide its letter dated 05:11:2012) drew attention of the Institute towards the communication No.15-1/2012-IFD dated 6th August, 2012 (copy enclosed Annex-I) as necessary guidelines to handle the instant issue.

In response to that, this Institute again approached the MHRD for a proper and clear cut clarification vide its letter dated 22.01.2013, but we have not received any clean direction on the matter. In the meantime, the DOPT has published a notification relating to the instant case on dated 28.03.2012 with certain amendments in CCS (Leave Rules), 1972(copy enclosed as Annex-II).

It is proposed that Prof. Swarup Kumar Mahapatra may be given pension on pro-rata basis as per rules.

The Board directed that the details of pension calculation may be sent to MHRD for concurrence with a copy to Joint Secretary and Financial Advisor, MHRD.

4) For setting up the a new Department of Food Process Engineering & hiring the services of Prof. Bal, IIT as a Visiting Professor.

The Institute is in the process of setting up a new department of Food Process Engineering. We have no prior establishment in the area and it is expected to be a totally new activity, hosted by the Department of Chemical Engineering.

We have identified a very senior retired faculty of IIT, Kharagpur, Professor Satish Bal. Professor Bal had an excellent academic career and service record at IIT. Apart from his academic career, he has excelled as an academic administrator.

It is proposed to hire the service of Prof. Bal as a Visiting Professor with following specifications.



- (1) Salary: Rs.79, 000 + DA and other allowances normally admissible to faculty, minus pension paid to him by IIT, Kharagpur.
- (2) Residential accommodation on campus on payment of license fee.
- (3) DA to be revised on normal rate.
- (4) Leave 2.5 days per month to be accumulated to total period of his tenure.
- (5) Faculty Development Allowance (FDA) and Leave Travel Concession (LTC) not admissible.
- (6) Medical facility: As per rules

Prof. Bal will serve as Head of the Department and will organise full department recruitment of faculty and staff, curriculum, Syllabi and sponsored R & D projects.

The Board approved the proposal.

5) Proposal for modification in the student Fee Structure (Note-16):

On the recommendation of FC vide No. FC-20(2012)-07, dt.04.10.2012, the BOG vide resolution BOG-31(2012)-05, dt.04.10.2012 had approved the composite student fee structure. It is observed that many students are not registering on the scheduled date of registration due to want of money and are applying for late registration when they have money to pay for semester registration. This is resulting in poor performance of such students due to missing classes in the beginning of the semester.

The matter was discussed in the 110th meeting of the Deans and Heads of the Department on 09.01.2013 and following were recommended:

- (i) Fee payment and semester registration will be delinked.
 - (ii) Those who do not register on the date fixed for registration, they will pay a late fee of Rs.1,000/- for late registration within 10 working days without permission. Permission of the Director will be required for registering beyond 10 working days from the date of registration.
- (iii) The fees will be paid between 1st July to 15th August for Autumn Semester and between 15th December to 15th January for spring semester without late fee. Students who will pay within next two weeks beyond the above period will be charged Rs.500/- as late fee. Thereafter Rs.2000/- will be charged towards late fee till 45 days counted from the date of registration after which registration will automatically stand cancelled unless otherwise permitted by the authority.
- (iv) Late Registration fee is distinct from late fees charged for delay in fee payment.
- (v) There shall be no provision of condoning late fee, even if the student had genuine reason to be late, except when the institute system is at fault, the burden of proof resting on the student.
- (vi) Mess fees and fines will be collected along with institute fees.
- (vii) There shall be no system of partial payment. The institute will raise demand note for the full amount.

The Board approved the proposal.

1. Selection of Architects for Master Plan and Construction of Buildings under Major Projects (Phase-III).

Earlier, prequalification applications were invited from leading Architects for providing comprehensive architectural service for the following projects:

It is realized that appointment of many architects for separate works as stated above may lead to non uniformity in the architectural features including architectural elevations, specification of materials etc. Therefore, it is desirable to award various works to a single Architect.

However, elevation treatment of CS, ME, Workshop and existing buildings may be assigned to another architect to be selected from the list of Architects who have applied earlier under "Renovation of existing academic buildings."

Accordingly, offers have been invited from Architects through fresh advertisement in Newspapers and NIT web site in 2 parts (i.e. 1: Techno commercial including prequalification requirements, Part2: Pricebid). The last date of submission was fixed on 21-03-2013.

Preparation of a technical Comparative statement indicating their experience, annual turnover etc. is in progress. Pregualified firms will be asked to give a presentation in the near future and the Selection of Architect will be done based on quality cum cost basis as per Guidelines of Government of India.

The BWC approved the proposal.

Appointment of Consultant for assisting in getting environmental clearance for undertaking Major Construction Works (Phase-II) (i.e Lecture Hall Complex No. II Mechanical Science Building, Faculty Residence, Satis Dhawan Hall & Golden Jubilee Building).

The Work Order for Construction of the above mentioned buildings has already been placed on M/s Snapcorji & Pallonjee & Co Ltd. The construction work will be taken up shortly. As per the Environmental Impact Assessment Notification of the Govt, of India, Ministry of Environment & Forests, Eastern Regional Office, Bhubaneswar, it is necessary to obtain environment clearance from concerned authority for which lot of formalities are to be observed. It is therefore necessary to appoint a Consultant for processing the case and obtaining environmental clearance.

The BWC approved the proposal.

3. Provision of Floor tile for "G" type quarters.

It is observed that the AS flooring in most of the 'G' type Quarters has been damaged and needs repair/renovation. It is proposed to provide ceramic tile flooring in these Quarters Further, minor repair works for door/window frames and shutters is necessary including providing white washing. In this regards, complaints have been received by the Estate Maintenance Office.

An estimate has been prepared and this will cost Rs. 94.00 Lakhs. Detail estimate given in the Annexure.

There has been large increase in the intake of students which will further increase in due course. It is therefore necessary to construct one 1500 seated Boys Hostel having a floor area of about 50.000 sqm. This will cost about Rs.108.0 crore (Based on Satis Dhawan Hall of residence tendered cost = Rs.72crore for 1000 students).

The BWC approved the proposal.

7. Name of Work: Construction of 'E' Type Flat (200 Nos.) for Non Teaching Staff.

There will be large increase in the strength of non teaching staff which will further increase in due course. It is therefore necessary to construct 'E' Type Flat (200 Nos). Out of which 150 nos. Flat Type (Storeyed having built up area of 50 Sqm. each for bachelors) with basement parking and 50 single type quarters of built up area of 83 Sqm.

This will cost about Rs.17.50.00 crores (11,650 x Rs.15,000/- sqm.). The BWC approved the proposal.

There is a large pond on the southern side of SS Bhatnagar Hall adjacent to the Technology Avenue (i.e. Puspa Pond). During monsoon period, storm water runoff from majority area of the campus find access into this pond. The excess water overflows through the weir into a valley area on the eastern side which finally discharges in to the river Koel. In order to conserve this water, it is proposed to create water bodies by channelizing the stream, raising barriers and construction of weir cum over bridge etc, which is under construction.

In addition to the above, it is necessary to deepen the existing Puspa Pond which is presently very shallow, so that the capacity of the pond can be increased.

A scheme has been prepared in house. BOQ and estimate have also been prepared which are enclosed.

For discharge of storm water runoff from the academic area and the road; it is necessary to construct a drain by the side of the above mentioned road, the cover of which will be utilized as foot path in view of space constraint.

4. DEPRECIATION

Depreciation is provided on written down value method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act, 1961.

Depreciation on fixed assets (TEQIP) has not been provided as per specification of the terms & condition of TEQIP-NPIU.

5. GOVERNMENT GRANTS

Government grants received during the year for capital expenditure are treated as Corpus Fund.

The Ministry of Human Resource Development has been receiving representations from Directors and Professors of NITs for grant of HAG Scale as they do not have further upward movement and stagnate at that level.

- 2. The issue relating to upgradation of Professor to HAG Scales was discussed and approved in the 3rd meeting of Council held on 18.11.2011, while discussing the Sarangi Committee recommendations regarding Recruitment Rules for Faculty and Non-faculty posts.
- 3. It is decided to grant HAG Scales of Rs. 67000 79000 without any grade pay to Professor in all NITs fulfilling the eligibility conditions given in enclosed guidelines for implementations of HAG Scales.
- 4. In order to have uniformity and hassle free implementation of HAG Scales, this Ministry has worked out small guidelines, which are self-explanatory. All NITs are requested to follow these guidelines while fixing the HAG scales to 20 % Professors including the Directors on deputation or on any other engagement working elsewhere in the country and abroad.
- 5. The placement may be initiated from the year 2012-13 onwards.

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Guidelines for implementation of HAG Scales for Professors in NITs.

- 1. As per the OM dated 21.07.2009 of Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure, 6th Central Pay Commission recommendation regarding the replacement of the pre-revised S-30 pay scale (Rs. 22400 Rs. 24500) by a new HAG scale of Rs. 67000-79000 with no grade pay was made through an amendment in the Central Civil Services (revised pay) Rules 2008 vide GSR no. 527 (B) dated 16th July 2009.
- 2. To implement HAG scales among the Professors of NITs, guidelines were issued vide para no. 2(d) of this Ministry's letter no. F-23-1/2008-TS-II dated 18th August, 2009 and 15th September 2010. The criteria to be adopted for award of such upgradation to HAG was approved by NIT Council in its third meeting held on 18.11.2011 as a part of Recruitment Rules for faculty and non-faculty. MHRD vide letter no. 33-7/2011-TS-III of 14th March 2012 has conveyed that personal interview for such upgradation will not be held.
- 3. A maximum of 20% of the sanctioned post of Professors who have 6 years of regular service, can be awarded HAG scales on the basis of recommendations of committee 'I' (given in para 3(c) below) to the Board by adopting the following procedure.
- a) Chairman Advisory Committee for Faculty Recruitment (ACoFaR) should invite, from all eligible and interested professors, the Bio-data incorporating their scholastic and administrative contributions since their appointment as regular Professor. It should prepare the list of candidates fulfilling all the minimum requisite conditions as prescribed by the Board.
- b) A committee (Called Committee 'II') consisting of Director or his nominee from the HAG Professors of the Institutes, two eminent subject experts approved by the Board, One Nominee of the Senate should evaluate objectively the claim made by the applicant.
- c) The recommendations of the committee 'II' should be placed before another committee consisting of the Director, as Chairman two Dean faculty welfare one each from NIT & IIT and Visitors Nominee (called Committee 'I') for final recommendations to be forwarded to the Board for its consideration and award of HAG scale. The Dean, Faculty Welfare shall act as Convener of this committee 'I' provided he/she is not a candidate for HAG, otherwise Dean Research and Development in case Dean Faculty Development (FD) excuse himself.
- 4. The eligibility criteria for selection will be as per Sarangi Committee Report:
- Professors with six years of regular service with Rs. 10000 AGP having at least 4 Ph. Ds guided, plus at least one full-time resident student continuing, at least 4 papers in science journals, 3 self-financed or 5 Government sponsored short term courses offered as coordinator and main teacher, three experiments or computational projects added to teaching laboratories, significant contribution to institutes management through personal initiatives in responsible positions will be immediately placed in the HAG scale. This criteria, however, should be used only in exceptional cases and quite sparingly.

- ii) For the professors who are entering laterally into the system, their seniority as professor or equivalent position will be considered in addition to the basic eligibility criteria as mentioned in para 4(i) above.
- iii) This exercise will be carried out by the Institute once in an academic year with a cut off as 30th June.

Detailed Proposal

I Introduction

Currently there is critical faculty shortage in technical education in the country. The proposed scheme is expected to fill up gap between demand and availability of bright committed aspiring teaching professionals, for example in NITs, taking fresh UG graduates, nurturing them for teaching along with the M Tech degree and PhD research carried out at IITs. The top 15% of the engineering graduates can fulfill their aspirations to receive their degree from leading prestigious Institutes in the country. It is expected that the present faculty crunch could be partially solved by implementing the "Trainee Teachers" scheme.

II Objectives

To enhance teaching quality and to address the faculty shortage issue, some of the best engineering graduates (i.e. top 15% meritorious students from the IIT, NIT, IIIT, IISER, NISER and other AICTE/UGC approved Institutions/Universities) could be attracted, motivated, and mentored. They would be engaged as Trainee Teachers at NITs. While initially they would assist in teaching, they would simultaneously go through part time M Tech and PhD programmes of IITs to acquire higher academic qualifications, which is a pre-requisite for faculty at NITs and IITs. Following are broad objectives of this scheme:

- a. Create high quality teachers
- b. To provide attractive teaching cum research carrier path to the UG student
- c. Catch bright UG students to enable them to Teach and Earn while you Learn and providing top class training to become good academician / researcher.

III Key Aspects of the Scheme

Each NIT would work out a perspective faculty recruitment plan for next five years based on current vacancies, projected growth, faculty recruitment through other channels, retirements and expected resignations. The plan should be seen and approved by respective BoG to be consistent with MHRD approved projections and norms for the institute. The number of Trainee Teachers to be admitted in an year would be

determined by distributing the admissions roughly equally over a period of five years. The perspective faculty recruitment plan could be reviewed periodically. Other channels of recruitment of faculty should also be pursued in parallel and should be factored in the perspective faculty recruitment plan.

Admission Methodology

- i. NITs will advertise and shortlist required numbers of fresh bright B Tech students from the current or one year prior to the current academic year in appropriate branches. These prospective candidates will go through comprehensive fast track screening procedure that meets all requirements for the selection of entry level regular faculty. The selection process would be completed once the candidate is accepted by the concerned IIT for the M Tech and PhD program. These students must satisfy the criteria of being within top 15% ranks and above in institutions of higher standing such as IITs, NITs, IIITs, IISERs, NISER and other Centrally Funded Technical Institutions (CFTIs) or those who are in top 15% from other AICTE/UGC approved Institutions/Universities (non-CFTIs) and having a valid GATE score would also be eligible. The probable number of trainee and their specializations can be decided by the NITs such that the number shall be within a prospective faculty recruitment plan and with prior approval by BoG.
- ii. These short-listed students will be asked for preference of minimum two IITs who offers such scheme. These students will be evaluated by corresponding IITs considering their eligibility criteria and their potential for teaching and performing research for M Tech and PhD program in the NKN enabled virtual learning mode. If the candidate is not selected by IIT for M Tech and PhD program by IITs, he/she will not be offered the trainee-teacher scheme.
- iii. The IITs and NITs will collectively generate broad contours of e-courses to help the trainee to complete most of the credits while serving in the NITs. The trainee teacher will spend one semester in the entire duration of the programme in corresponding IIT for their M Tech and

PhD work. Course work would include adequate coverage on teaching pedagogy in addition to covering courses relevant to M Tech & PhD programme.

Duration and Salary

- The Trainee Teachers will mainly help the Institute for Laboratory and Tutorial classes,
 Research and progressively play bigger role in academics and research in the NITs.
- 2. The status of Trainee Teachers will be like Contractual Employees with annually increasing consolidated salary on an equivalent scale (compensation higher than a regular PhD fellow but lower than an Assistant Professor) with regular leave, medical facilities, accommodation / HRA as applicable, transport allowance etc. Also all the fees and some professional expenses towards the M Tech and PhD programme will be reimbursed through this scheme. Part of the salary will be retained by the Institute, placed in Recurring Deposit (RD) and this would be returnable to the trainee in a phased manner, only after successful completion of PhD.
- 3. It is necessary for the Trainee Teachers to complete M Tech and PhD within 5-8 years. If candidate fails to complete his PhD within eight years, his or her candidature to be in this scheme will be discontinued. The trainee teacher also can opt out of the scheme by giving sufficient notice to the administration and it should be effective only after completing academic requirements towards the end of current semester. In such a case the amount kept in RD will be forfeited.

Regularization of Candidate

After successful completion of the PhD, the trainee teacher will be absorbed as Assistant Professor at appropriate pay scale in the parent NIT and service rendered as trainee will be counted for various benefits admissible to employees of NITs.

Implementation Support

The scheme will be reviewed every year by MHRD and after 3 years by an external committee.

IV Financial Outlay

Financial outlay has been worked out as per unit cost given in Annexure-1.

A. Financial Requirements for eight years

While the actual numbers to be admitted as Trainee Teachers at a NIT would be based on approved perspective recruitment plan as indicated above, purely for the purpose of working out the budgetary requirements a representative number of 300 Trainee Teachers to be admitted every year for all NITs put together has been assumed. Actual annual budgetary requirements would need to be adjusted based on annual MHRD reviews of the scheme. Table I given below indicates the details of buildup of possible number of candidates in the scheme as a first step

Number of Trainee Teachers at any time to be within projected vacancy position at the end of training period of the given NIT(s). In the old NITs, currently there are about 30 to 40% faculty vacancies. In the first eight years of this scheme, it is expected that the number of vacancies would be reduced substantially.

It is suggested that TT should get some funds for professional expenditure like membership of professional societies, attending conference, for which they should apply for, if their paper is accepted for presentation etc.

V Operational Details of the Scheme

For operational clarity, the scheme once approved should be implemented jointly by the IITs and NITs with their roles in the schemes as briefly outlined below.

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1) Role of IITs:

- a. To select students jointly with NITs for "Trainee Teachers" programme
- b. If found suitable, enrol students for M. Tech and Ph. D programmes.
- c. To deliver the programme in Virtual Mode such that the "Trainee Teachers" are available to the parent NIT for a maximum period to facilitate teaching-learning activities at NIT
- d. To deliver contents related to pedagogy which are in addition to the conventional course / programme requirements
- e. To arrange review of progress once in a year by concerned IIT faculty supervisor(s) and representative(s) from sponsoring NIT
- f. Coordinate all activities in regard to its implementation of the scheme with NITs or a centralized body created for its implementation
- g. To nominate one contact / nodal person from each IIT side (may be Dean (R&C) / (Acad.) or equivalent) for its effective implementation, monitoring and co-ordination of the scheme.

2) Role of NITs:

- a. To plan and implement the scheme keeping in view the overall requirements of faculty in a given time frames
- b. To identify, shortlist and recommend bright students for "Trainee Teachers" programme
- c. To train TT as potential faculty and facilitate their interaction with IITs for M. Tech and Ph D programmes and also engage them suitably in teaching learning activities in their own institute
- d. To disburse salary and other perks and benefits to "Trainee Teachers" in their respective institutions including fees to IITs.
- e. To possibly join IIT faculty in review of the progress of the TT in Indian Institute of Technology.
- f. To absorb them in regular faculty positions upon successful completion of the Ph D programmes.

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VI Conclusion

The scheme should be launched from the next academic year 2013-14 itself after obtaining necessary approval from the MHRD and other concerned GoI bodies. Necessary budgetary provisions (for year 2013-14) should also be made for financing the scheme on long term basis. The concerned BoG of every NIT should make effective plans to make use of the scheme to mitigate the shortage of faculty on a long term basis. While doing so, they should adequately balance the recruitments from various channels including the "Trainee Teacher" Scheme. NIT council shall create a sub-committee to co-ordinate and monitor the scheme.



Considering the programme structure and placement facility, B.Tech and Dual Degree B.Tech & M.Tech Students will avail the scheme only in their 6" semester for a duration of 6 months at European Union host



February 2013 for mobility in Autumn semester 2013-14, due to the time constraint the current 6th semester students (Spring Semester 2012-13) cannot be considered for the Autumn semester 2013-14. However, students who will be in 5th semester in Spring 2013-14, will be permitted to process their application in June, 2013 and their mobility will start in February 2014.

2) M. Tech programmes:

For the (M. Tech students who have completed 1 year at NIT Rourkela, their application will be considered for project work and the duration will be considered for 6/10 months. B.Tech final year students are not permitted to apply for the 1st semester of M.Tech in the host universities.

3) Ph.D. programme:





2013-43-Senate-09: Grade change of Sri Achinta Roy, Roll No. 110El0144 in the course EC100:Basic Electronics of Spring semester 2011-12:

Sri Achinta Roy Roll No. 110El0144 had secured F grade in the paper E0100 Basic Electronics in his 2nd semester (Spring 2010-11). Subsequently he appeared as backlog in Spring 2011-12 and the course teacher uploaded P grade which was reduced to F due to attendance shortage. No request for the change of grade was received from the department.

On 26th December 2012 Academic Office received a request from the department for the grade change of the above students from P to B on the ground that in Spring 2011–12 the uploaded grade was only on the basis of the End-Semester marks and no cognizance for Mid-Sem and TA were taken.

Since the request for change of grade has not been received within 3 weeks from the date of starting of the semester (as per the Academic Regulation), it was put up to the Senate to decide whether the grade change request will be appetiable now after completion of one semester.

The Senate deliberated on the issue and approved the consideration of TA and Mid-Sem component marks along with End-Sem marks as submitted by the DAC. The grade reduction will be as per rule. Accordingly, the student is deserving to get B grade [(Mid-Sem = 19.5) + (End-Sem = 40) + (TA=11) = 70.5]. The grade will be reduced by two steps; one for shortage of attendance and the other for backlog and hence the student will finally secure "D" grade in the course EC100.

1. Leave for students going for Summer Internship:

Students of 3rd year B. Tech and Dual Degree and 1st year M. Tech, M.Sc., MA and MBA programmes going for Summer Internship in India or abroad can be permitted leave without attendance penalty up to 15th August or the last date of internship + 3 days of travel time whichever is earlier. However, all other academic requirements are to be complied by the students. Entire travel and academic plan need to be worked out and approved by Dean(Aca) on recommendation of HOD before the student leaves for internship. This facility will be extended only in selected cases, when the internship is part of a well publicized standard programme with financial support and not for individually worked out programs.

2. Summer course under Guided Self Study mode for final year students:

- a) There will be no Supplementary Examination for final year students irrespective of the numbers of failures in the subject.
- b) For such students department will offer Summer Course if viable depending on number of failures in the subject.

c) If regular Summer Course is not possible, students will be permitted toregister for the course under "Guided Self Study" mode, where a teacher will be assigned by the department for every course and evaluation will be afresh under 3 components T.A. Mid- Semester, and End Semester examinations.

There will be regular contact between the students and teacher; the teacher will give and evaluate assignments.

- d) Summer courses, whether in regular class room mode or in guided self study mode will start shortly after completion of end semester examination of spring semester. For Spring semester courses, for final year students only, it may start after publication of results.
- e) Mid-Semester & End-Semester Examinations will be conducted separately by the Academic Office, may be at a convenient date.
- f) Students are required to give biometric attendance by registering their biometric impression in the Computer Centre. In case of instrument breakdown signing in registers may be accepted.
- g) Minimum attendance taken on the Biometric Attendance system should be 30 days.



2013-44-Senate-17: Any other matter with permission of the Chair:

1) i) Erasmus Mundus Heritage Programme:

The Senate had set a threshold CGPA level of 8.0 for students to apply for the exchange mobility under the HERITAGE (Erasmus Mundus) program. This level was set to control the number of applicants and ensure the high quality of applicants. However, there were very few (~2-3) M.Tech applicants with 8.0 and above CGPA. Thus, the Director 'Chairman, Senate was approached and, he had given a provisional approval of 7.5 CGPA for the M.Tech students to be eligible for applying the HERITAGE program. Currently, Shri Jyoti Prakash Meher (CGPA 7.85) and Shri Deepak Pal (CGPA 7.54) have been selected by the Erasmus Mundus for 10 months mobility to European Universities and both of them have the CGPA of less than 8.0.

The Senate decided that the students should be allowed for the mobility and the threshold CGPA level be set to 7.5 for all future Erasmus Mundus Programmes...

ii) Case of Shri Chiranjibi Sahoo (Roll No.710ME4087):

Shri Chiranjibi Sahoo (Roll No. 710ME4087) is a Dual Degree (B. Tech in Mechanical Engineering & M. Tech in Mechatronics and Automation) student (VI Semester) of the NITR and has been permitted by the Erasmus Mundus for 10 months mobility to Politonico di Torino, Italy. However, we have not yet obtained a confirmed list of courses that the student can enrol in the European Institution. The host European Institution though has accepted the courses listed in the learning agreement have also informed that the final list of courses can be modified upon the arrival of the student (in September 2013) in the host institution and thereafter, a final list of courses and the learning agreement would be made available. It is to be noted that, among the available courses at the host institution, only those courses which will be taught in English will be offered to the student. In that case, the actual credit available for transfer may be less than 60 (in ECTS scale). Considering that credits in ECTS include both contact and non-contact



hours, it may lead to a situation where the student may fall short of required credits as per our academic requirement.

The Senate deliberated on the issue and permitted Shri Sahoo to proceed to the European University and he will complete Research Project – I(Summer) during July – August, 2013. Other academic requirements will be adjusted in future.

Recommendations of the Fifth Central Pay Commission – Regarding.

The undersigned is directed to say that the recommendations of the Fifth Central Pay Commission contained in paragraphs 46.34 and 46.36 of its Report in respect of stenographers in the <u>non-Secretariat</u> Central Government offices have been examined in consultation with the Ministry of Finance (Department of Expenditure) and it has been decided as follows.-

- (i) All posts of Senior Personal Assistant in non-Secretariat Central Government offices should be re-designated as <u>Private Secretary</u>:
- (ii) (a) Stenographic assistance at the level of <u>Senior Private Secretary</u> in the pay scale of Rs 7,500-12,000 should be allowed to officers of the level of Additional Secretary to the Government of India or equivalent and above in non-Secretariat Central Government offices.
- (b) Posts of Senior Private Secretary should be created in the pay scale of Rs.7,500-12,000 by upgradation of the posts of Private Secretary (including the erstwhile posts of Senior Personal Assistant, now re-designated as Private Secretary);
- (c) The number of posts to be upgraded as Senior Private Secretary shall be equal to the number of posts of the level of Additional Secretary to the Government of India or equivalent and above in non-Secretariat Central Government offices; and
- (d) The upgradation of the existing incumbents of the posts of Private Secretary (including the erstwhile posts of Senior Personal Assistant, now re-designated as Private Secretary) to the posts of Senior Private Secretary shall be in accordance with the instructions contained in the Department of Personnel and Training Office Memorandum No.22011/10/84-Estt(D) dated February 4, 1992 read with Office Memorandum No.AB-14017/2/97-Estt(RR) dated May 25, 1998 (copies enclosed).

Subject:-Scale of Stanographic Assistance to Officers in Subordinate Offices.

Attention of the Ministries/Departments is invited to the Department of Personnel & Training OH No.28034/1/88-Estt(D) dated 6.2.89 wherein the level of stenographic assistance for Officers of subordinate offices has been indicated.

- 2. In order to improve the promotion prospects of Stenographers in the Non-Secretariat/Subordinate Offices it has been decided to take the following measures:-
 - (a) Under the OM dated 6.2.89 referred to above, stenographic assistance is admissible only a officers at the level of \$.3000-1500 and above. It has now been decided that where stanographic assistance is presently available to officers below the level of \$.3000-4500 on functional justification based on recommendation of \$IU/IWSU, the existing sanctioned posts of Stenographer for such officers may be retained. In cases where the stenographic support to officers below the level of \$.3000-4500 is not based on the recommendation of IWSU/\$IU, the obntinuance of the posts of Stenographer may be considered afresh based on a study of the workload by \$IU/IWSU. If no justification is found on the basis of such study for the centinuation of the post(s), the same may be abolished after it is vacated by the present, incumbent.
 - grade of Stenographers (Gr.III), wherever possible, on functional considerations, one Stenographer Gr.II (S.1400-2600) may be provided to two Officers entitled for a Stenographer Gr.III (S.1200-2040) each. Such arrangement once made will be final. The implementation of this decision may be suitably phased to ensure that it: does not lead to any of the existing Stenographers Gr.III being randered surplus.

- ((c) Stenographic assistance at the level of 8.1640-2900(Gr.I) may also be provided to functional posts in the scale of 8.4500-5700 and 25% of JAG posts in the scale of 8.3700-5000 after identifying such posts on the basis of stenographic workload.
- The scheme indicated above magi result in the upgradation of certain posts from the level of \$1200-2040 to the level of \$1400-2600 and also from the level of \$1400-2600 to the level of \$1640-2900 and abolition of a few posts in the scale of \$1200-2040. It is not necessary to obtain approval of the Cabinet in the matter and the individual Ministry/Department take further action in consultation with the FAs.
- 4. It is requested that Ministry of Agriculture, stomay initiate expeditious action to implement these decisions so as to relieve stagnition among stemographers in nonsecretariat/subordinate offices under them.

These posts were granted the replacement pay scale of PB-2 with GP of 1 4200 under 6th CPC revision w.e.f 01/01/2006 and subsequently re-designated as Secretary as per the new Staff Structure

Sri B. N. Sahoo and Sri B. B. Behera are the incumbents who are working as Secretary to Director and Secretary to Registrar, respectively. Both have been granted GP of 1.4600 and designation of Sr. Secretary under MACP scheme wie fig. 17/03/2018 and 17/03/2010, respectively.

OM No = 35034/4/97-Estt(D), dated 11th April, 2001 issued by DoPT, Gol (copy enclosed) requires that all posts of Sr. Personal Assistant in non-Secretarial Central Government offices should be re-designated as Private Secretary and posts of Sr. Private Secretary should be created in the pay scale of 7500-175-12000 (5th CPC) by up-grading the posts of Private Secretary (including the erstwhile posts of Sr. Personal Assistant). The OM also provides for upgrading of the existing incumbents of the posts of Private Secretary (including the eistwhile posts of Sr. Personal Assistant).

5th CPC pay scale of Sr. Personal Assistant was 6500 200-10500, revised to PB-2 with GP OF 14600 under 6th CPC. As such, the post is equivalent / analogous to the post of Sr. Secretary in the institute. Further, the post of Sr. Private Secretary is equivalent / analogous to the post of Secretary (Selection Grade – II) in PB-2 with GP OF 14600.

Accordingly, it is proposed to up-grade the existing incumperts in the post of Sr. Secretary to the post of Secretary (Selection Grade + II) as per provisions of above OM



As per Rule 37 of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972 Government employees on their absorption in Central Autonomous Body / Public Sector Undertaking are entitled to pensionary benefits as per the provisions in Rule 49 of CCS (Pension) Rules 1972. As per Rule 49 (2) ibid (as amended vice riotification No.33/37/03-P&FW(A) dated 02 09:2008 and 30.12:2009), Government servants retiring in accordance with the provisions of tiese Rules after completing qualifying service of not less than 10 years, the amount of pension shall be calculated at 50% of emoluments or average emoluments, whichever is more beneficial to them. The amount of pension is calculated as per provisions of Rule 49 of CCS (Pension) Rules where linkage to full pension with 32 years service has been removed.

- 2. A doubt had arisen as to whether the provision of Rule 37 of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972 apply to the employee of Autonomous Bodies covered under the CCS (Pension) Rule, 1972. The matter was referred to the Department of Pension &PW for advice whether the provisions of Rule 37 can be extended to the Central Autonomous Bodies which have edopted old CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972 i.e. whether the employees of a Central Autonomous Body covered under CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972 permitted to be absorbed in a service or post in an Autonomous Body Controlled and financed by Central Government are eligible to get the centefits of getting full pension as per amended Rule 49 of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972—after completing 10 years of service in the previous organization governed by CCS (Pension) Rules.

1. Full Pension on completion of 10 years of Qualifying Service u/r 49 9(b) of CCS Pension Rules 1972.


According to Rule 49 (b) of CCS [Pension] Rules 1972, in case of Government Servant retiring in accordance with the provisions of these rules before completing qualifying service of 33 years, but after completing qualifying service of 10 years the amount of pension shall be proportionate to the amount of pension admissible under clause (a) and in no case the amount of pension shall be less than Rs.3500 per mensum.

The above provisions of the rules have been changed on recommendations of the Sixth CPC and amended as under vide Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances & Pensions, Department of Pension & Pensioner's Welfare OM No. F.No.38/37/08-P&PW(A) dated 02.09.2008.

Para 5.2: Linkage of full pension with 33 years of qualifying service shall be dispensed with. Once a Government servant has rendered the minimum qualifying service of twenty years, pension shall be paid at 50% of the emolument or average emoluments received during the last 10 months, whichever is more beneficial to him.

Para 5.3: In cases where Government servant becomes entitled to pension on completion of 10 years of qualifying service in accordance with Rule 49(2) of CCS (Pension) Rules 1972, pension in those cases shall also be paid at 50% of the emoluments or average emoluments, whichever is more beneficial to the Government servant.

Therefore, it is very clear from the provisions of Para 5.2 above that those who have completed 10 years of qualifying service and become entitled for pension [In cases of Superannuation, Invalid and Compulsory retirement] will get full pension without linking to qualifying service.

- 3) Students provided with family accommodation in institute quarters (if any) will be attached to a half for married students. They will pay seat rent at the higher rate of S.S. Bhatnagar Hall of Residence.
- 4) Hostel seat rent (except that for family accommodation) includes electricity charges up to 50 units per student per month, average. Excess consumption will be billed extra, uniformly for all the students of the half.
- 5) Tuition (ses and development fees can be borne by research projects in case of students of all categories, if the student's research activity has a bearing on the project.
- 6) Medical fee will entitle the student to free treatment and medicines at the Institute Health Centre, plus insurance cover against hospitalization if such a scheme is adopted by the Institute.
- 7) Students are required to pay fees during all the semesters (or part thereof). They are in the roll of the lost tute from admission till thesis submission.
- 8) Institute employees enrolled in M.Tech.(Res.) or Ph.D. Programme are exempted from paying all fees except admission fee and examination fee.
- 9) Foreign students coming under different schemes will pay tuition fee at a rate fixed under the scheme, instead of the rate given above.

- 14) Candidates for D.Sc. Degree will pay thesis evaluation fee equal to that for Ph.D students.
- 15) B.Tech/ Dual Degree (3.Tech & M.Tech)/ M.Sc./MA/ M. Tech and MBA students will be given coupons to buy books of their choice against the book fee paid at the beginning of every segrester.
 - Semester fees shall normally be payable at the time of Pre-registration, which is done in the previous semester or at the time of admission. Delayed payment will altract penalty which may be waived in case of students awaiting receipt of scholarships or Bank Loans till. Semester registration date, but not beyond.
- 17) If a student fails to submit thesis within one month of acceptance of synopsis by the Academic Office, the thesis processing fee needs to be paid again.

The inquiry was fixed on 17/04/2013 vide office order no. NITR/RG/13/M/703, Dt. 27/03/2013. I appeared before the inquiry officer and appealed for an extension of date on account of my academic commitments. My appeal was upheld and the date of inquiry was extended to 11/06/2013. No proceeding was drawn in my presence nor any orders passed. On 11/06/2013 I appeared before the inquiry officer and filed a petition to provide me with the list of witnesses of the Management; to provide me with the copies of the documents relied upon by the Management and to permit me to be represented through an Advocate of my choice in the inquiry as the issue involved complicated matters of law and fact and the presiding officer engaged by the Management is a seasoned, retired Judicial Officer. A copy of my petition is enclosed at Annexure 1 for your ready perusal.

The inquiry officer instructed the Presenting Officer to provide me with the list of witnesses without further delay. He initially observed that I shall not be permitted with the copy of the document relied upon by the Management. After much persuasion he relented and asked the Presenting Officer to provide the copy of the said documents to me. However, the inquiry officer expressed that he was not competent to dispose off my representation concerning permission for being represented by an Advocate in the inquiry. No proceeding was drawn in my presence or orders passed.

In the aforesaid back ground I am approaching this highest body, the Honorable BOG, to decide my representation to permit me to be represented through a legal practitioner in the inquiry, on the following grounds:

The rules governing disciplinary proceedings do not prohibit the appearance of legal practitioner in domestic inquiry. It stipulates, an employee facing departmental inquiry, can take the assistance of another co-employee and this right is absolute. In case the Management is represented through a legal practitioner, the employee has an absolute right to be represented through a legal practitioner.

However it is at the discretion of authorities to allow the employee to be represented through a legal practitioner. The issues have been agitated before different courts including the Honorable Supreme Court of India. I take the leave of the Honorable BOG to the decision of the Apex Court in the matter of Bombay Port Trust case (air 1983 sc 109) where the Honorable Supreme Court relied with affirmation the observation of Lord Denning.

QUOTE

"I should have thought, therefore, that when a man's reputation or livelihood is at stake, he not only has a right to speak by his own mouth, he has also the right to speak by counsel or solicitor."

In the instant case the inquiry officer is a legally trained person, the presenting officer is also a legally trained person as by virtue of his post he is to act referring various statutes and he has been the presenting officer in all enquiries. Thus he has acquired a legal mind in the mean time.

It is further submitted that both my reputation and livelihood are at stake.

In the circumstances I request the Honorable BOG to allow me to take the assistance of an advocate of my choice during the conduct of the inquiry.

In the absence of thereof I am not in a position to prepare for my defense. I, therefore, pray that the management may be directed to supply me the list of witnesses and the copies of the documents relied upon by the management.

The proposed inquiry involves complicated questions of fact and law. I am not in a position to defend myself in the domestic inquiry appropriately. As held by the honorable Supreme Court of India in the matter of Bombay Port-Trust case, I may be permitted to be represented through an advocate of my choice. In the instant case the inquiry officer is a retired District Judge and therefore, I may be permitted to be represented through an advocate of my choice. Further, I may be allowed to add here that the service rules applicable to me does not prohibit the representation through an advocate in domestic inquiry. I may, therefore, be permitted to represent my case through an advocate of my choice.

I am further to state that I may be permitted to file my detailed statement after I receive the copies of the documents relied upon by the management.
