About the Centre of Excellence on Public Health Nutrition, Dept. of HSS, NIT, Rourkela

The Department of Humanities and Social Sciences has started a Centre of Excellence with the support of UNICEF. The primary objective of the CoE is to strengthen collaboration on knowledge management for child survival and development. The Centre intends to focus on all 30 districts of Odisha.

The CoE regularly conducts various assessments and studies, develop policy notes, process documentation, and situational analyses, facilitate workshops/training, and engage in academic collaborations and knowledge management.

Background

The effects of climate change are already being felt everywhere. Most strikingly, they are felt through the water. Increased demand for water due to low rainfall and prolonged drought conditions can cause water sources (including boreholes and springs) to run dry. Conversely, heavy rainfall and flooding can damage water sources and sanitation facilities, carry runoff and waste into streams and lakes, and contaminate water supplies.

Water scarcity through climate change and the resulting increase in water cost (socio, economic and ecological) can lead to inequitable access. This may deprive households of opportunities to collect the safe water needed for proper handwashing and hygiene, limiting children's ability to grow healthy and strong.

Objective of the workshop

The basic objective of this workshop is to build the capacities of researchers, development professionals, academicians and policymakers on Climate Change and its impacts on water sector in general and accessibility of water, sanitation, and hygiene facilities on masses in specific.

The workshop aims to develop the capacities and knowledge of the development practitioners, NGOs functionaries, academicians, and policymakers on facilitating plans and programs - including research projects - that can build resilience against climate change impact to clear hurdles in the provisioning inclusive WASH services for all.



The focus of this workshop would be on the role of policymakers and practitioners in long-term and community-based planning and responses for making an impact in the present context of a larger public health perspective.

Who should attend?

This workshop would benefit researchers, development practitioners, faculty, policymakers, and NGO officials. This workshop will particularly be useful for those interested in learning the WASH and climate change adaption modalities specific to public health and professionals who manage projects and are looking to upgrade their skills and expertise. Further, monitoring and research teams from NGOs and government organizations responsible for planning and developing policy proposals would find the workshop extremely useful. Around 20 candidates will be selected for this workshop.

Resource Persons

The resource persons will be a mix of WASH and Climate Change sector experts and eminent academicians from NIT Rourkela and other institutes of repute.

Travel and Accommodation Details

National Institute of Technology (NIT) will provide accommodation, food, and local hospitality to the participants in the guest houses of the institution without any cost. Depending on the availability of funds, travel costs will be reimbursed to those participants who claim train (3rd AC) or bus fare 'to and from' Rourkela.
